News: Assam's Deepor Beel soars above garbage mounds; survey shows more birds in wetlands

- ➤ Deepor Beel, Assam's only Ramsar site, which is troubled by development projects and urban waste, has 30 more waterfowl species than the total counted in 2022, a bird survey conducted on January 4 has found.
- Altogether 26,747 birds belonging to 96 species were recorded during the count at the wetland on the southwestern edge of Guwahati.
- ➤ The recent exercise was conducted by the Guwahati Wildlife Division of the Assam Forest Department.

Dipor Bil

- ➤ Dipor Bil, also spelt Deepor Beel (Bil means "lake" in the local Assamese language), is located to the south-west of Guwahati city, in Kamrup Metropolitan district of Assam, India.
- ➤ It is a permanent freshwater lake, in a former channel of the Brahmaputra River, to the south of the main river.

- ➤ It is of great biological importance and also essential as the only major storm water storage basin for the city of Guwahati and is the only Ramsar site in Assam and an Important Bird Area (IBA).
- The beel is a staging site on migratory flyways and some of the largest concentrations of aquatic birds in Assam can be seen, especially in winter.
- ➤ Some globally threatened birds are supported, including the spot-billed pelican, lesser and greater adjutant stork, and Baer's pochard.
- The 50 fish species present provide livelihoods for a number of surrounding villages, and Nymphaea nuts and flowers, as well as ornamental fish, medicinal plants, and seeds of the giant water lily Euryale ferox provide major revenue sources in local markets; orchids of commercial value are found in the neighboring forest.
- ➤ Potential threats include over fishing and hunting pressure upon waterbirds, pollution from pesticides and fertilizers, and infestation by water hyacinth.
- A proposal to create a sewage canal from the city directly to the beel is considered to be disastrous in its potential effects.
- ➤ The Dipor Bil is reported to provide, directly or indirectly, its natural resources for the livelihood of fourteen indigenous villages (1,200 families) located in its precincts.

- ➤ Recently, the Kamrup (Metropolitan) district administration has prohibited community fishing at Deepor Beel.
- ➤ Recently, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change notified the eco sensitive zone of Deepor Beel Wildlife Sanctuary.

Eco – Sensitive Zone

- These are protected areas that act as "shock absorbers". They also act as transition zones.
- > They are governed by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.
- ➤ There are no acts to govern the zone as land is a state subject.
- ➤ Instead, they are regulated by guidelines framed by MoEFCC.
