- African Bald Eagle, (scientific name: Haliaeetus leucoceph) is found on most of North America, including most of Canada, all of the continental US, and northern Mexico.
- ➤ It is the only sea eagle endemic to North America.
- ➤ The average life span of bald eagles is 20 to 30 years.
- ➤ Bald eagles build their nests at the very top of tall trees so the eggs will be safe.
- Female bald eagles are a bit bigger than the males.
- ➤ Besides live fish, bald eagles also prey on other birds, small mammals, snakes, turtles, and crabs, and they readily eat carrion (decaying flesh of dead animals).
- ➤ The American bald eagle (National bird of the US since 1782) was taken off the endangered species list in 2007.
- ➤ Since then, their population has steadily increased, which is considered as one of the biggest success stories in the history of conservation.
- ➤ IUCN Status presently is Least Concern (LC).
