News: Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary

- ➤ Recently, in a significant development for tiger conservation efforts, the Goa bench of the Bombay High Court has issued a directive to the Goa government to notify the Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary and its surrounding areas as a tiger reserve under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 within three months from 24th July 2023.
- Tiger Reserves are notified by State Governments as per provisions of Section 38V of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 on advice of the National Tiger Conservation Authority.

Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary

- Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary is located in the Northern part of Goa, Sanguem taluka, near Valpoi town.
- ➤ It encompasses picturesque waterfalls, including Vazra Sakla Falls and Virdi Falls.
- ➤ Mhadei is known for its nesting grounds of critically endangered Long-billed vultures near Vazra Falls.

- ➤ Diverse landscape with thick moist deciduous forests and some evergreen species.
- ➤ It is also notable for sacred groves protecting rare and indigenous trees.

Flora and Fauna

- ➤ Rich biodiversity with Indian gaur, Tigers, Barking deer, Sambar deer, Wild boar, Indian hare, and more.
- Attracts herpetologists due to the presence of various snakes, including the 'big four' venomous snakes which are Indian krait, Russell's viper, Saw-scaled viper and Spectacled cobra.
- Mhadei has been declared as a Designated International Bird Area (IBA) for hosting several bird species like Malabar parakeet and Rufous babbler.
- ➤ Represents a crucial habitat for tiger conservation in Goa.

Unique Geographical Features

- ➤ Home to the three highest peaks in Goa: Sonsogod (1027 mts), Talavche Sada (812 mts), and Vageri (725 mts).
- Mhadei River, a lifeline of Goa, originates in Karnataka, passes through the sanctuary, and meets the Arabian Sea at Panaji.
- ➤ The sanctuary acts as a catchment area for the Mhadei River.

➤ Recently, the Bombay high court has directed the State government of Goa to declare Mhadei Wildlife Sanctuary as a designated Tiger Reserve.

Tillari Conservation Reserve

- > Tillari is the seventh wildlife corridor in Maharashtra to be declared as a 'conservation reserve'.
- > Tillari is a reserve in Western Ghats.
- The area covering nine villages in the forest range is known to serve as a corridor and even as a habitat for the population of tigers and elephants moving between the three states of Goa, Karnataka and Maharashtra.
- > It connects Mhadei sanctuary in Goa and Bhimgad in Karnataka.
- ➤ It has semi-evergreen forest, tropical moist deciduous forests, and a number of unique trees, butterflies, and flowers.
- > Recently, a king cobra was sighted on Tillari.

National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA)

➤ National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) is constituted under Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 (amended in 2006).

- ➤ It was established in 2005 December following the recommendations of Tiger Task Force.
- ➤ It was an executive body and later given statutory status after the amendment of Wildlife Protection Act in 2006.
- ➤ NTCA along with Wildlife Institute of India, in collaboration with state forest departments conducts the Tiger Census once in 4 years.
- ➤ It also conducts the leopard census once in 4 years.
- > NTCA is headed by Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.
