Bharat Net

- ➤ Bharat Net is the world's largest rural broadband connectivity programme using Optical fiber.
- ➤ It is a flagship mission implemented by Bharat Broadband Network Limited (BBNL) a special purpose vehicle (SPV) set up by Government of India under the Companies Act, 1956.
- ➤ Currently, it is being implemented by the Department of Telecommunication under the Ministry of Communications.
- ➤ The project is being executed by BSNL, RailTel, Power Grid & is being funded by Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF).
- ➤ It aims to connect all of India's households, specifically rural households through demand, affordable high speed internet connectivity to fulfill the objectives of Digital India programme in partnership with the states & private sector.
- ➤ It intends to cover all 2.5 lakh Gram Panchayats for E-governance, E-Commerce facilities.

- ➤ Ministry of Communications recently said that the scope of BharatNet has now been enhanced to connect all the 6,43,000 inhabited Villages of the country.
- National Optical Fibre Network (NOFN) was launched in October 2011 and was renamed as Bharat Net Project in 2015.

National Optical Fibre Network

- ➤ It was envisaged as an information superhighway through the creation of a robust middle-mile infrastructure for reaching broadband connectivity to Gram Panchayats.
- The Ministry of Communications has launched the National Broadband Mission that will facilitate universal and equitable access to broadband services across the country, especially in rural and remote areas.
- ➤ The Union Cabinet recently, approved a viability gap funding support of up to ₹19,041 crore for the implementation of the BharatNet project through Public Private Partnership (PPP) model in 16 States.
- ➤ The project will be extended to all inhabited villages beyond the gram panchayats in 16 States Kerala, Karnataka, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh.

➤ Recently, Bharat Broadband Network Limited has invited global tender for the Development of BharatNet through Public Private Partnership model in 9 separate packages across 16 states.

Viability Gap Funding (VGF)

- ➤ Viability Gap Funding (VGF) means a grant one-time or deferred, provided to support infrastructure projects that are economically justified but fall short of financial viability.
- ➤ If the sponsoring Ministry/State Government/ statutory entity aims to provide assistance over and above the stipulated amount under VGF, it will be restricted to a further 20% of the total project cost.
